

This Little Piggy Makes Me Happy Card



Supplies:

Stamps: This Little Piggy (CM 143922/WM 143919)

Cardstocks: Pear Pizzazz (131201), Powder Pink (144244), Melon Mambo (115320), Whisper White (100730)

DSP: Coffee Break (144155)

Inks: Powder Pink (144084), Melon Mambo (126948), Pear Pizzazz (131180), Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)

Dies: Layering Ovals (141706), Welcome Home Framelits (143752), Up & Away Thinlits (142748), Big Shot (143263)

Ribbon & Twine: Powder Pink 1/2" Finely Woven Ribbon (144134), Whisper White Solid Bakers Twine (124262)

Misc: Aqua Painter (103954), Paper Snips (103579), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

Cutting Measurements:

- Card base: Powder Pink 8 1/2" x 5 1/2" - scored at 4 1/4"
- Green layer: Pear Pizzazz 4" x 5 1/4"
- Pink layer: Melon Mambo 3 7/8" x 5 1/8"

Instructions:

1. Attach the Pear Pizzazz layer to the card base and then the Melon Mambo layer on top of that
2. Use a die from Welcome Home Framelits to cut the green & white striped banner, cut in half & adhere to the card base
3. Stamp the pig image onto a piece of White cardstock and cut out using the largest oval die
4. Stamp the pig image onto a scrap piece of Powder Pink cardstock and using sharp Paper Snips to cut it out – then use Snail adhesive to adhere it to the pig shape on the white cardstock
5. Color in the flower and pig ear, snout, feet and tail using inks
6. Color the grassy area using Pear Pizzazz ink and an Aqua Painter for a nice watercolor effect
7. Use Dimensionals to attach the oval layer in place over the banner
8. Use dies from Up & Away Thinlits to cut the clouds and adhere in place
9. Fold a piece of Powder Pink Finely Woven Ribbon in half and use a Mini Glue Dot to secure it just underneath the oval
10. Die cut the sweet little stem using another die from Welcome Home Framelits, add it just underneath the oval and add a white bakers twine bow on top as a sweet finishing touch.
11. There you have a sweet piggy card, ready for giving 😊
