

## Pink Baby Girl Moon Baby Card



### Supplies:

**Stamps:** Moon Baby (CM 143085/WM 143082)

**Cardstocks:** Powder Pink (144244), Watercolor Paper (122959)

**DSP:** Whole Lot of Lovely DSP (144110)

**Dies:** Layering Squares Framelits (141708), Up & Away Thinlits (142748), Big Shot (143263)

**Inks:** Memento Tuxedo Black (132708), Powder Pink (144090), So Saffron (105225), Crumb Cake (121029), Pink Pirouette (111843)

**Misc:** Aqua Painters (103954), Subtles Enamel Dots (141679), Dimensionals (104430), Snail (104332)

### Cutting Measurements:

- Card base: Powder Pink 4 ¼" x 11" - scored at 5 ½"
- White layer: Watercolor Paper 4" x 5 ¼"
- DSP layer: Whole Lot of Lovely 3 ¾" x 5"

### Instructions:

1. Stamp the baby sleeping in the moon image using Memento Tuxedo Black Ink onto Watercolor Paper – use Ink Refills and an Aqua Painter to color the image – I used the following colors: So Saffron (moon & star), Powder Pink (onesie), Pink Pirouette (face & hand) and Crumb Cake (hair) – adhere this white layer to the Powder Pink card base using Snail
2. Take your piece of pink dotted DSP and use a square die from Layering Squares Framelits to cut the window in it – use the stamped image to help with your alignment – once cut, adhere in place so that the baby image peeks through
3. Die cut the clouds out of Watercolor Paper using dies from Up & Away Thinlits and stamp the words onto them and add to the card front using Dimensionals.
4. *Sarah's Tip* – if you want to stamp just one or two words from a multiword stamp like I did here, take your stamp, cover the words you don't want to stamp with masking tape, ink up your stamp and peel off the masking tape – you will see that only the exposed word that you want to stamp is inked up – quick & easy and makes your stamps more versatile 😊
5. Add a little yellow star shaped Enamel Dot to the stamped star (if desired) and a yellow heart to the top cloud for cute finishing touches
6. And there you have one cute baby girl card ready for giving – that you can easily make into a boy baby card simply by using different patterned paper and ink color for the onesie 😊
