

Dracula in his Coffin Halloween Treat Box

Here is a super cute treat that is fun & easy to make - Dracula is on a piece of folded acetate so that you can bend him forwards to fill the box with candy and then back again once done...



Supplies:

- **Die Cutting:** Home Sweet Home Thinlits (140279), Big Shot (143263)
- **Stamps:** Cookie Cutter Halloween (CM 142255/WM 142252), Jar of Haunts (142247)
- **Punch:** Cookie Cutter Builder (140396)
- **Twine:** Halloween Night Bakers Twine (142027)
- **Cardstocks:** Basic Black (121045), Whisper White (100730), Real Red (102482)
- **Ink:** Tuxedo Black Memento (132708)
- **Adhesive:** Mini Glue Dots (103683)
- **Misc:** Acetate Sheet, Candy

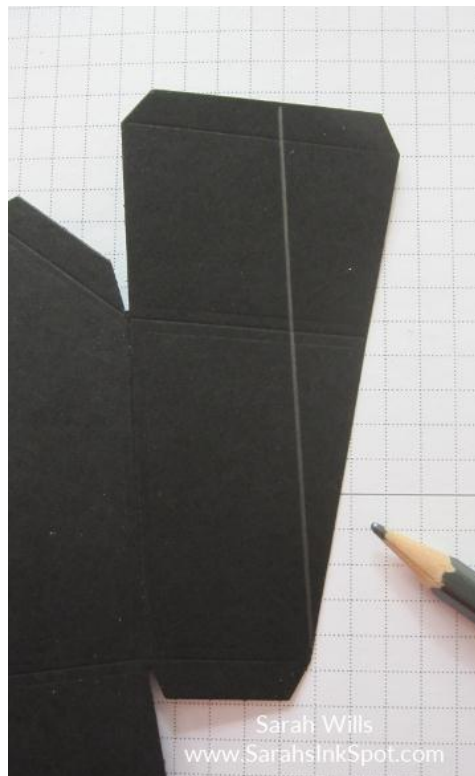
Instructions:

1. Use the house shaped die from Home Sweet Home to cut 2 shapes out of Black cardstock
2. Take one of your die cut shapes and look at the longest side edge – you need to square this. Take a ruler & line it up with the long score line – draw a pencil line from top to bottom & cut along it – you will cut away an almost triangular piece – *see photo on pg 2* – then repeat for the other piece
3. Take one piece & fold along all score lines – use glue dots or Snail along those tabs & adhere in place
4. Take the second piece & cut off the small black square flap at the bottom – then fold along all score lines and use adhesive to attach to the first piece – now you will have your basic coffin shape
5. You can cut off the tabs on the lid or leave them – the lid stays in place better if you leave them on
6. Use the same die to shape an insert if you wish – red cardstock is awesome for this!
7. Stamp your Dracula & use the punch to shape him - cut a strip of acetate and fold in half – attach one end to the back of Dracula & the other to the coffin – glue dots work great for this
8. Fill your box with candy, decorate the lid, tie around Bakers Twine to hold in place & there you have one super cute Halloween spooky treat ready for gifting!
