Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:


- Dies: Large Letters Framelits (141712), Everyday Jars Framelits (141490)
- Cardstock: Early Espresso (119686), Crumb Cake (120953), Whisper White (100730)
- Tools: Big Shot (143263), Simply Scored (122334), Paper Snips (103579)
- Punches: Ticket Tear Border (143718), Cookie Cutter Builder (140396), Tree Builder (138295), Fox Builder (141470)
- Ribbon & Twine: Crumb Cake Classic Weave (144162), White Solid Bakers Twine (124262)
- Adhesives: Mini Glue Dots (103683), Tear & Tape (138995), Dimensionals (104430), Fine Tip Glue Pen (138995)
- Misc: 3x6 Gusseted Bags (141704), 6x17 Gusseted Bags (142001), Basic Pearl Jewels (144219), Graham Crackers, Chocolate Bars, Marshmallows

INSTRUCTIONS:

 $1 - Fill \ a \ 6 \ x \ 17$ Gusseted Cellophane Bag with graham crackers, chocolate bars & marshmallows – I popped the marshmallows into 3 x 6 Gusseted bags to keep them from making everything sticky – tie with bakers twine to close and cut off excess cello at the top of the large bag.



2 – Use the Large Letters Framelits dies to cut lettering from Early Espresso cardstock



3 – To make the Marshallow Man: use the smallest jar die from Everyday Jars Framelits to cut two shapes for your marshmallow man – use the larger die to cut off the band section on one of them



4 – Use the Tree Builder Punch to cut two branch shapes from Early Espresso cardstock and use Paper Snips to cut off the extra pieces



5 – Use the Fox Builder Punch to punch this shape for the mouth – use Paper Snips to shape it using the bottom curve as your guide



6 – Use the Cookie Cutter Builder Punch to make shapes for his eyes – alternatively you can use small circle punches for this – use the Fine Tip Glue Pen to add to the top marshmallow along with a Pearl Jewel for his nose



7 – Assemble his head to his body part using Dimensionals



8 - Add the twig arms and a small heart if desired to his chest



9 – To make the bag – place a piece of 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ x 11 Crumb Cake cardstock into the Simply Scored with one of the longest edges along the top and score down at $\frac{3}{4}$ "



10 – Turn your cardstock around and score down at $\mbox{\em 3/}{\!\!\!\!4}"$, 1 $\mbox{\em 1/}{\!\!\!\!4}"$, 7" and 7 $\mbox{\em 3/}{\!\!\!\!4}"$



11 – Repeat so that you have two pieces – shape the top edges on both with the Ticket Tear Border Punch (the top edge has no score line running along it)



12 – And this is what you will have




13 – Fold along the bottom score line




14 – Fold along the side score lines as shown below



15 – Repeat for both pieces of cardstock – on one of them, cut the corners out at the bottom




16 – And on the other piece, cut the whole bottom strip off along that score line that is $\mbox{\%}''$ in from the bottom edge



17 – Take one of the pieces and add Tear & Tape Adhesive to the length of one of the side flaps – adhere in place and then stick down the other part of that flap on the same side



18 – Repeat on the other long side and this is what you will have



19 – Add Tear & Tape Adhesive to the inside of the bottom flap and fold up and over the outer edge of the upper piece to close the bottom of your bag



20 – And this is what you will have – your bag is now ready for decorating!



This is how I decorated my bag – all items that I used are listed in the supply list at the top of this Project Sheet:
