



Halloween Cocoa Mix Treat Tube Rack

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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Stamps: Merry Café (144965)
- Inks: Basic Black Archival (140931)
- Cardstock: Basic Black (121045), Very Vanilla (101650)
- Designer Paper: Spooky Night (144610)
- Tools: Big Shot (143263), Simply Scored (122334), Paper Snips (103579)
- Punches: ¾" Circle (119873), 1/8" Circle (134365)
- Dies: Coffee Cups Framelits (143745)
- Ribbon & Twine: Vintage Crochet Trim (144611), Basic Black Solid Bakers (141682)
- Misc: Treat Tubes (144612), Black Rhinestone Jewels (144639), Cocoa Powder, Mini Marshmallows, Pumpkin Spice Morsels
- Adhesives: Tear & Tape (138995), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332), Dimensionals (104430)

INSTRUCTIONS:

1 – Cut a piece of cardstock to measure $7\frac{3}{4}$ " x $6\frac{3}{4}$ " and put into your scoring tool with the $6\frac{3}{4}$ " side along the top – score down at $1\frac{1}{4}$ " in from each side



2 – Turn around so that the $7\frac{3}{4}$ " edge is along the top of your scoring tool – score down at $1\frac{1}{4}$ ", $3\frac{1}{4}$ ", $4\frac{1}{2}$ " and $6\frac{1}{2}$ " – fold along all score lines



3 – The smallest flap will be an adhesive flap – turn so that your adhesive flap is at the bottom and use your paper trimmer to trim diagonally each side from the bottom to the second score line as follows:



4 - Take a 3/4" Circle Punch and evenly space holes along the very top section for your tubes – be sure to place them a little more away from the edge and towards the body of the cardstock to allow for the adhesive flap to close.



For perfect placement, I punch out 4 circles from scrap paper and use them to position my holes – then I draw around each with a pencil. Punch the holes out and use an eraser to rub out the pencil marks.

5 – Down each side cut in along each horizontal score line to the first vertical 1 ¼" score line to create the flaps in the sides of your box – fold along all score lines



6 - 'Dry' fold your box to make sure that it all fits together – you might need to trim your adhesive flap depending on the position of your punched circles and if any others need a little trim, now is the time to do it.

Apply a strong adhesive such as Tear & Tape to that long adhesive flap, line up and secure in place...



7 - Fold the side flaps in ensuring that the largest is on the outside of your box for a neat finish and adhere all in place...



8 – Pop in your tubes and now your box is ready for decorating and filling 😊



This is how I decorated my box – all items that I used are listed in the supply list at the top of this Project Sheet:



I made a small tag for one of the tubes using the 3/4" Circle Punch – I cut out the potion bottle and added it and attached it with Black Solid Bakers Twine:



And here is a close up of the cup – I used a die from Coffee Cups Framelits to cut all of the shapes that make up that cup – the cup, the lid, the 'hole stopper' on the top and the sleeve:



The band of patterned paper around the box measures 12" x 1 3/4" – when wrapping that paper around be sure to start where your cup is going to go – then wrap all the way around and the other end will finish under the cup for a nice seamless band.
