

MATCHBOOK CHOCOLATE SQUARE HOLDER

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
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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamps: One Big Meaning CM 139420/WM 138788), Layered Leaves (Paper Pumpkin Sept 2017)
Cardstocks: Early Espresso (119686), Crumb Cake (120953), Cajun Craze (119684), Fresh Fig (144242), Very Vanilla (101650)
DSP: Painted Autumn (144613)
Embossing Folder: Layered Leaves Dynamic (143704)
Die Cutting: Seasonal Layers Thinlits (143751), Stitched Shapes Framelits (145372), Big Shot (143263)
Punches: Decorative Ribbon Border (143721), 1" Circle (119868)
Ink: Early Espresso (126974)
Twine: Linen Thread (104199)
Misc: Ghirardelli Chocolate Square, Simply Scored (122334), Tear & Tape (138995), Fine Tip Glue Pen (138309), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

INSTRUCTIONS: 1 – Cut two pieces of cardstock in the colors of your choice to measure: 7 3/8" x 2 ¾" and 5 ¾" x 2 3/8" 2 – Take the larger outer piece and place into your score tool and score at: 3", 3 1/2" and 6 3/4" sarah wills 3 – Fold along the score lines like so... sarah wills 4 - Take the smaller inner piece of cardstock and score at: 2 1/4", 2 1/2", 2 3/4" and 5", 5 1/4", 5 1/2" sorah wills

5 – Fold along those score lines using mountain and valley folds to create a concertina effect...



6 – Apply a strip of very strong adhesive tape to the side and bottom edge and push firmly together to create your pocket



7 – Apply strong adhesive to the bottom of the pocket - be very careful to apply the adhesive strip as low as you can so that the top flap can tuck inside



8 – You are going to stick this pocket to that little flap on the outside piece – line up and push down firmly in place. By adhering it to this little flap, you can move your chocolate holder forwards giving you room behind it to stamp a sentiment or write a note



9 – This is how your project will look at this point...



10 – And this is how it looks with a chocolate square in there...



11 – And here it is all closed up – the front flap tucks behind the little one bottom one just like a matchbook – you may need to trim that front flap to get a perfect fit
