

This Little Piggy Polka Dot Card



Supplies:

Stamp: This Little Piggy (CM 143922/WM 143919)

Die Cutting & Embossing: Layering Ovals Framelits (141706), Polka Dot Basics (143709), Big Shot (143263)

Cardstocks: Chocolate Chip (102128), Crumb Cake (120953), Blushing Bride (131198), Whisper White (100730)

Ink: Aqua Painters (103954), Wild Wasabi (126959), Blushing Bride (131172), Tangerine Tango (126946), Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)

Ribbon & Twine: Powder Pink 1/2" Finely Woven Ribbon (144134), Crumb Cake 3/8" Classic Weave (144162), Whisper White Solid Bakers Twine (124262)

Misc: Paper Snips (103579), Rhinestone Jewels (144220), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Fine Tip Glue Pen (138309), Snail (104332)

Cutting Measurements:

- Card base: Chocolate Chip 4 1/4" x 11" - scored at 5 1/2"
- Layers: Crumb Cake 3 7/8" x 5 1/8", Whisper White 3 3/4" x 5"

Instructions:

1. Cut the Crumb Cake and White layers – emboss the White layer using the Polka Dot Basics Embossing Folder and adhere to the Crumb Cake one
2. Use the largest scallop oval die from Layering Ovals to cut the Chocolate Chip mat and adhere in place
3. Cut a piece of Powder Pink Finely Woven Ribbon and wrap around both layers – add a piece of Crumb Cake Finely Woven Ribbon on top and adhere both in place using tape on the back and add to the card base
4. Wrap around a piece of White Bakers Twine and adhere to the back of the card front
5. Stamp the image onto White cardstock and cut out using an oval die from Layering Ovals – stamp the pig image onto a piece of Blushing Bride cardstock and cut out the pig using Paper Snips and adhere to the stamped pig on the white layer – use a Blushing Bride Marker or Aqua Painter to color the ears, snout and feet
6. Color the grass & leaf using Wild Wasabi and the flower using Tangerine Tango
7. Add the finished stamped oval onto the Chocolate Chip scallop mat using Dimensionals
8. Tie a bow onto the Bakers Twine and there you have one sweet Piggy card ready for giving 😊
