Stamps: Petal Palette (CM 145788/WM 145785) BUNDLE: Petal Palette (CM 145974/WM 145973)

Die Cutting & Embossing: Petals & More Thinlits (145655), Big Shot (143263), Magnetic Platform (130658), Big Shot

Die Brush (144262), Simple Stripes Embossing Folder (145648)

Tools: Simply Scored (122334), 1 1/4" Circle Punch (119861)

DSP: Sweet Soiree Specialty (145564)

Cardstocks: Crumb Cake (120953), Old Olive (100702), Whisper White (100730), Basic Black (121045), Sticky Notes

Ink: Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)

Blends Markers: Crumb Cake Light (144582), Old Olive Light (144574), Calypso Coral Combo Pack (144045)

Twine & Embellishments: Linen Thread (104199), Wink of Stella (141897), Glitter & Clear Epoxy Shapes (145632)

Adhesives: Tear & Tape (138995), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

## **Cutting Measurements:**

• Base: Crumb Cake - 8 1/2" x 3 1/4"

Front Panel: same color as the card base - 4 1/4" x 3 1/4"

• Layer: Old Olive - 4" x 3"; Whisper White 3 7/8" x 2 7/8"

## **Instructions:**

1. Take the Crumb Cake base and pop into your scoring tool with the long side at the top – make two score lines – one at 4 1/4" and the second at 6 3/8"



2. Apply strong adhesive tape to the top small panel...



3. Take the front panel, line up in place and adhere the top part to it...



4. Fold along the two score lines in opposite directions like this...



5. Attach a pad of sticky notes to the end of the bottom piece – I used about 1/3 of a stack of 3x3 sized notes...



6. This is what it looks like when you tuck that front panel behind your sticky notes for your desk...



7. And this is what it looks like folded flat for your purse or bag...



8. And now the fun bit – decorating it! This is how I decorated mine – all supplies I used are listed in the Supply List above...
