



Silver Mini Gable Box Church Gift Card Holder

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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamps: Better Together (CM 141736/WM 141733)

Die Cutting: Home Sweet Home Thinlits (140279), Sweet & Sassy Framelits (141707), Picnic Basket Builder Framelits (145658), Pinewood Planks Dynamic EF (143708), Big Shot (143263)

Tools: Paper Snips (103579)

Punch: Tree Builder (138295), 1/8" Circle (134365)

DSP: Foil Frenzy Specialty (144125), Color Theory (144193), Petal Garden (144168)

Cardstocks: Dazzling Diamonds Glitter (135315), Vellum (101856), Crumb Cake (120953), Early Espresso (119686),

Ink: Early Espresso (126974)

Ribbon: Whisper White 1/4" Organza (145590)

Embellies: Clear Faceted Gems (144142), Petal Passion (145591), Rhinestone Basic Jewels (144220)

Adhesives: Fine Tip Glue Pen (138309), Tear & Tape (138995), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

Misc: Silver Mini Gable Box (145568)

1 – Take a Silver Mini Gable Box and locate the flap that holds it together – you are going to open it out flat in order to die cut the door and windows. To do this, take a flat blunt bladed instrument like a table knife and gently run it between the flap and the outer side of the box to break through the adhesive – be sure to use gentle movements to avoid tearing it...



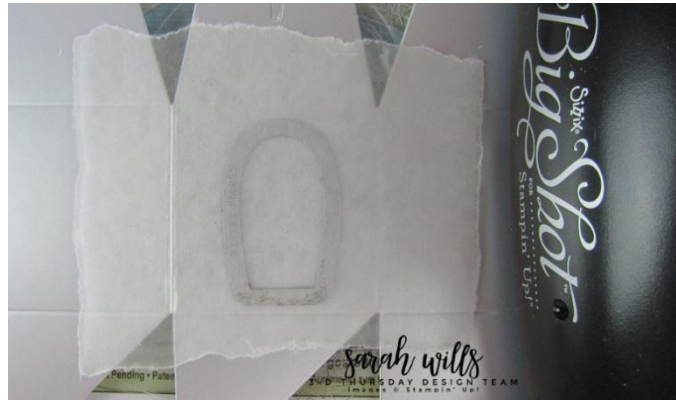
2 – Once done, open it out and this is what you will have...



3 – Take the door opening die from Home Sweet Home Thinlits and position it on one of the small end panels – use the Magnetic Plate to help hold it in place...



4 – If you have well loved & scored cutting plates like I do, you can protect your silver box from getting marked by the top plate by laying a piece of Wax Paper over the die – this will stop your pretty silver box from getting marked...



5 – It's really important to line up the side of the top cutting plate with a score line or the end of the box in order to avoid a line that the plate will impress onto it when you run it through the Big Shot – it's hard to see but I lined mine up with the right side score line...



6 – Carefully run through your Big Shot and this is the door cut that you will have...



7 – Now to cut the windows – center the window die over one of the larger panels and run through the Big Shot – again, use Wax Paper to protect your silver finish...



8 – And then cut two more windows on that side and repeat for the other larger panel – this is what your finished die cuts will look like...



9 – Use strong adhesive tape to reattach the flap and assemble your box. If desired, you can pop a small set of LED lights in there along with your gift/gift card for a cute touch – put the switch next to the door inside so that you can open the door to turn them on and off 😊
