



## Hello 3D Watering Can

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## Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Stamps: Rooted In Nature, Accented Blooms
- Inks: Granny Apple Green, Gray Granite, Lovely Lipstick
- Cardstock: Whisper White, Lovely Lipstick, Lemon Lime Twist, Granny Apple Green, Mango Melody
- Accessories: Iridescent Sequin Assortment, Whisper White Classic Weave Ribbon, Metallic Brads
- Tools: Simply Scored, Layering Ovals Framelits Dies, 1" Circle Punch, Tailored Tag Punch, Nature's Roots Framelits Dies, Tombow Multipurpose Glue, Snail Adhesive, Tear & Tape, Paper Snips, Stampin' Dimensionals, Mini Stampin' Dimensionals, Paper Piercer, Glue Dots
- Miscellaneous: Pencil

## INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Cut a piece of Melon Mango Cardstock to measure 8-1/2" x 4-1/2". Score on the 8-1/2" side at 1/2", 1-1/2", 4-1/2" and 5-1/2". Score on the 4-1/2" side at 1". I have drawn black lines to show you how:



2. Snip the small score lines and cut each side at an angle to create tabs and remove the corner tab:



3. Add Tear & Tape on the long tab at the end and assemble the box sides:



4. Add multipurpose glue to the two small tabs on the bottom of the box and glue the first flap in place over the two small flaps:



5. Add Tear & Tape to the last flap and fold over to glue in place:





6. Create 2 oval rings using the 2-1/4" and 2-7/8" ovals from the Layering Ovals Dies and Melon Mango Cardstock:



7. Place one oval under the box at an angle to form the handle and trace two lines on the oval. Using Paper Snips, cut an additional 1/4" from the pencil line to create tabs. Do this for both ovals:



8. Fold on the pencil lines to form tabs. Add glue to the tabs on one part only on the underside and glue layered over the second piece as shown in Photo 2. Add glue to the center of the handle and press both pieces together:



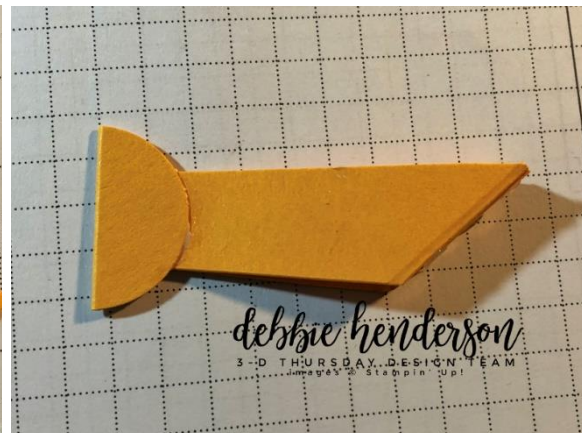
9. Add Glue Dots to the two ends and press in place on the side of the box, about  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top:



10. Cut one circle using the 1" Circle Punch and Melon Mango Cardstock. Score and fold in half. Cut two strips of Melon Mango Cardstock to measure  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $\frac{3}{4}$ ". Place under the box to trace the angle for the spout. Using Paper Snips, cut an additional  $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the pencil line for a tab. Using the Paper Snips again, cut from the pencil line to the other end at an angle on both sides to create an angled piece as shown in Photo 2. Repeat on both pieces. Fold on pencil line to create a tab:



11. Glue both pieces together by overlapping the tabs. Add 3 Glue Dots to the end. Add glue to the inside of one strip and press the other strip in place to glue them together. Fold the circle in half and glue to the top of the spout:





12. Press the spout in place on the opposite side to the handle, about  $\frac{1}{2}$ " from the top:



13. Cut a strip for the inside of the box using Melon Mango Cardstock measuring 4" x  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Score at  $\frac{1}{2}$ " on both ends and fold in opposite directions. Glue to the inside top of the watering can as shown in Photo 2:



14. Cut a strip of Melon Mango Cardstock to measure 5" x  $\frac{1}{2}$ ". Add adhesive to each end and glue to the inside of the box to create a handle:



15. Decorate the box top by first adding a Metallic Brad to the handle using the Paper Piercer.

Add the leaves and flowers from the Rooted In Nature stamp set cut with the Nature's Roots Dies. I used Lemon Lime Twist Ink and Cardstock, Granny Apple Green Ink and Cardstock, Lovely Lipstick Ink and Cardstock and Whisper White Cardstock with Gray Granite Ink.

Glue the cut pieces in place on the front, middle and back sections at the top:



For the front of the box, stamp the sentiment on Whisper White Cardstock stamped with Granny Apple Green Ink and cut out using the Tailored Tag Punch. Glue in place using Stampin' Dimensionals. Glue the leaves and flowers in place using Stampin' Dimensionals also.

Glue assorted sizes of the sequins in place to the front and to finish off the project, tie a piece of ribbon to the handle.

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
