



## Halloween Door Hanger Box of Treats

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### Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

**Stamp:** Spooky Sweets (CM 147716/WM 147719)

**BUNDLE:** Spooky Sweets (CM 149973/WM 149974)

**Die Cutting:** Layering Circle Framelits (141705), Large Letters Framelits (141712), Big Shot (143263)

**Cardstocks:** Black Foil (147898), Vellum (101856), Silver Glimmer (146960), Basic Black (121045)

**DSP:** Regals 6x6 Stack (146965)

**Punches:** 2 1/4" Circle (143720), Detailed Trio (146320), Cat (144666), Spooky Bats (148014), Darling Label (Punch Box 146855)

**Tools:** Simply Scored (122334), Paper Snips (103579)

**Ink:** Jet Black Stazon (101406)

**Misc:** Rhinestone Basic Jewels (144220), Black 5/8" Glittered Organdy (147897), Silver Bakers (145569), Tear & Tape (138995), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332)

1 – Cut a piece of cardstock to measure 10" x 3" and place into your scoring tool with a long edge along the top – score at 8"



2 – At the opposite end use a 2 ¼" Circle Punch to create the hanging hole – or you can use a circle die if you prefer...



3 – Cut another piece of cardstock to measure 8" x 4 ½" and place into your scoring tool with a long edge along the top – score at 1/2", 2 1/2", 5 1/2" and 7 1/2"



4 – Turn so that the short edge is along the top and score down at 1”



5 – Use sharp paper snips to create diagonal cuts on your tabs as shown below – this will make it easier to fold them and secure in place...



6 – Fold along all score lines...



7 – Turn over so that you have the ‘wrong’ side facing you (the inside) and apply strong adhesive tape such as Tear & Tape to the flaps as shown below...



8 – Take the backing tape off of the large center panel tab and adhere to the back of the bottom 2” section on the hanger piece...



9 – Take the backing tape off of one of the side bottom pieces and secure underneath the bottom – repeat for the other side...



10 – Take the backing tape off of both of the remaining side pieces and adhere to the back of the hanger piece...



11 – And this is what you will have – a hanger with a box section below...



12 – If you would like to shape the corners at the top of your hanger piece, use a corner rounding punch or the Detailed Trio punch to do it – it is easiest to do this at step 2 but if you forget you can do it now...



And now the fun bit – decorating time!

This is how I decorated mine – all items that I used are listed in the supply list at the top of this Project Sheet:
