

Envelope Punch Board Hand Warmer Pouch By Twila Davis



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## Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Stamps: Tags & Tidings
- Inks: Mossy Meadow
- Cardstock (CS): Very Vanilla, Cherry Cobbler
- Designer Paper (DSP): Festive Farmhouse
- Accessories: Linen Thread, Glue Dots, Tear Tape, Snail
- Tools: Paper Trimmer, Envelope Punch Board, Big Shot, Cable Knit Emboss Folder, Christmas Tags Thinlits Die, Paper Snips
- Miscellaneous: Button, pair of Hot Hands Hand Warmers

## **INSTRUCTIONS:**

1. Cut a piece of the Festive Farmhouse (Plaid) DSP to  $6" \ge 6"$ . Using the Envelope Punch Board use the measurements to make a  $3" \ge 4"$  envelope. Don't forget to round your corners with the corner rounder part of the board.



2. Turn envelope so that the smaller flaps are at the top and the bottom. Fold them in pointing toward the middle. Add Tear Tape as shown in the picture.



3. Fold the pack of hand warmers in half, letting the back half be a bit wider and place inside the soon to be pouch.



4. Peel of the smaller Tear Tape paper and fold the left flap. Then peel of the larger Tear Tape paper and fold over the right flap, making your pouch.



5. Belly Band - Cut a piece of Cherry Cobbler CSt o 1 1/2" x 7 1/2". Put the CS in the Cable Knit Emboss Folder all the way in and run about 2/3 of it through the Big Shot and back it back out.



6. Put the CS back in the Cable Knit Emboss Folder lining the cables up and over lapping what you have embossed already by one cable length. Run through till you go over that piece and back back out. This will give you a competed embossed piece larger than 6".



7. The cables will be running the opposite way, but it won't be noticeable. Don't worry if where the cables overlapped does not look super good, that part will be on the back.



8. Place the pouch on top of the Belly band centering it in the middle. Add Tear Tape to the right end of the Belly Band and fold the flaps over and secure.



9. Using Mossy Meadow Ink, Ink up the Tags and Tiding Stamp Set (ink up the whole stamp for extra tags) on a piece of 6" x 8" piece of Very Vanilla CS and cut it out using the Big shot and Matching Christmas Tags Thinlits Die. I used the Warm wishes Tag. Also take a button and a piece of Linen Thread and thread it through the button and tie it in a bow.



10. Use Snail to attach the tag to the front of the pouch. Fringe out the thread ends of the bow at this time if you would like. Trim accordingly. Add a glue dot to the back of the button and place over the whole in the tag on the pouch. Your project is complete. There is also enough room in the pouch for a Gift Card, maybe to a Sporting Goods Store or Home Goods Store. Your Project is complete and ready to put in your favorite guy's stocking!
