

## **Window Box Easter Basket**

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## Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

**Stamp**: Best Bunny (147136), Country Home (147678) **BUNDLE**: Best Bunny Photopolymer Bundle (148378)

Die Cutting: Window Box Thinlits (142762), Big Shot (143263)

Cardstocks: Crumb Cake (120953), Soft Suede (115318), Whisper White (100730), Melon Mambo

(115320), Garden Green (102584), Sparkle Glimmer (146957)

**DSP**: Needlepoint Nook (148807) **Punch**: Bunny Builder (147039)

Ink: Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)

Ribbon & Twine: White Solid Bakers (124262)

**Misc**: 3x6 Gusseted Cellophane Bags (141704), Clear Faceted Gems (144142), Basic Brads (146930), Paper Snips (103579), Paper Piercing Tool (126189), Tear & Tape (138995), Fine Tip Glue Pen (138309), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Hersheys Chocolate Eggs

Take the large base box die from Window Box Thinlits and place onto your Big Shot platform and add the striped insert die inside the hexagon part...



Run through your Big Shot and this is what you will have...



Use your paper trimmer to cut the top hexagon section away and discard...



Cut a second piece the same way...



Take one of the pieces and turn around – place into your paper trimmer with a short edge at the top...



Line up so that the vertical downward cut is along the 1 1/4" measurement and cut...



And this is what you will have...



Fold along all score lines and add strong adhesive tape to the two small side strips...



Adhere together...



Take your second piece and trim it to leave just the two small side flaps and the center panel...



Fold along all score lines and apply strong adhesive tape to the two small side flaps and the bottom of the center panel...



Adhere in place to the first piece...



Use your Paper Snips to cut away the end pieces that stick above your main basket...



For the handle, cut a strip 1/2" wide and 7" long and adhere to the inside of the basket – if you prefer you can cut the handle longer so that it reaches all the way into the bottom...



This is how I decorated mine – all items that I used are listed in the supply list at the top of this Project Sheet:
