

ENVELOPE COOKIE POUCH

Stampin' Up! Supplies Used: Stamps: Dino Days (149406) Dies: Dino (149636) BUNDLE: Dino Days (151139) SUITE BUNDLE: Dinoroar (152194) Cardstocks: Whisper White (100730) DSP: Dinoroar (149589), Subtles 6" x 6" (149615), Noble Peacock (149493), Gold Glimmer (146958) Inks: Early Espresso (147114), Soft Suede (147115), Old Olive (147090) Ribbon & Twine: Crushed Curry 3/8" Crinkled Seam Binding (149444) Misc: Whisper White Medium Envelopes (107301), 6" x 8" Cellophane Bags (102210), Simply Scored (122334), Paper Snips (103579), Dimensionals (104430), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Snail (104332), Tear & Tape (138995), Cookies, Die Cutting Machine, Paper Trimmer Take a medium envelope and place onto your Scoring Tool or Paper Trimmer with score blade inserted – short edge along the top – and score down $\frac{1}{2}$ in from the bottom envelope edge...



Turn the envelope around so that the bottom edge is along the top of your tool – in the left corner, score at $\frac{1}{2}$ " down until you meet that scored intersecting line – then repeat for the other corner...



Create a score line diagonal across the first small square that you created with the two score lines – and repeat for the other corner...



Gently fold along the large score line and use your bone folder to make a nice crisp line...



Turn the envelope over and fold the flap back on itself, again using your bone folder to get a nice defined crisp line...



Use your fingers to gently fold the small score lines (including the diagonal one)...




Pop your hand into the envelope and gently open it up...



Gently push down on the inside and use your other hand on the outside to push the fold you created in – the bottom of your envelope will start to open out like this...





Once both flaps are adhered, this is the shape you will have...



Gently take the envelope flap and push it inside your envelope – this will give greater rigidity to your finished pouch but if you prefer, you can trim it off instead...



And now your pouch is ready for decorating & filling!



If you want to stamp directly onto your envelope, do this at the very beginning so that it is nice and flat. You can also add a patterned paper to your flap – use the flap as a template to cut out the paper and use snail along the top to adhere in place...



Once decorated, pop a cookie into a food safe cello bag, trim with ribbon and slip into your pouch...



The cookie slides right out...



I had my girls custom bake nice yummy large chocolate chip cookies to fit my pouch!
