



HALLOWEEN PEEPS SLIDE OUT TREAT HOLDER

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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamp: Spooktacular Bash (150544)

Cardstocks: Basic Black (121045), Basic Gray (121044), Gorgeous Grape (146987), Black Foil (147898), Whisper White (100730)

DSP: Monster Bash (150447)

Dies: Wicked (150725), Ornate Frames (150664)

Embossing: Stylish Scroll Folder (150665)

Punch: 1 1/2" Circle (138299)

Tools: Simply Scored (122334), Bone Folder (102300), Paper Snips (103579), Paper Trimmer

Ink: Gorgeous Grape (147099)

Ribbon & Twine: Magnolia Lane Ribbon Combo Pack (149485), Basic Black Scalloped Edge (150449), Black Glittered Organdy (147897)

Misc: Noble Peacock Rhinestones (149494), Monster Bash Enamel Shapes (150448), Peeps Halloween Marshmallows

Adhesives: Tear & Tape (138995), Black Stampin Dimensionals (150893)

Cut a piece of cardstock to measure 9" x 7 1/4" – place in your scoring tool with a short side along the top and score down at 1 1/4"



Rotate so that a long edge is along the top of your tool and make 4 score lines as follows: at $2\frac{1}{2}$ ", $3\frac{1}{2}$ ", $6\frac{5}{8}$ " and $7\frac{5}{8}$ "



To make the flaps – at the bottom - each end - measure out and mark a line $\frac{3}{4}$ " down from the bottom score line on those two end squares – and trim away the pieces below the line.



On the two small squares at the bottom use Paper Snips to cut to the intersecting lines to create flaps – I have folded these below so you can see what I mean...



Fold along all score lines...



The central portion between the small flaps that you made needs trimming – use your paper trimmer to cut off 1/4"



If you wish to cut a hole in your box top now is the time to do it! Fold your box up so that it fits into your die cutting machine or punch and cut your desired shape

And now to assemble! For rigidity and ease of folding your box together, take your Halloween Peeps box and place on the large center panel...



Turn it over so that back of the box is facing you and fold your flaps together to test close it.



When happy with your box closure, use a piece of strong adhesive tape along one of the long edges and press down firmly to secure.



To secure the end, fold in your flaps...



And use strong adhesive tape along a long edge to secure them in place...



And voila! You are all ready for the fun bit – decorating!



The other end is left open so that the box can be pulled out – it is designed to be a snug fit so that the box of treats doesn't fall out...



This allows you to simply pull it out – see how cute it looks with Frankenstein popping out!



You can add a piece of ribbon with a loop on the end to allow for easy pulling out of your box like I did below...
