

Free as a Bird Laser-Cut Card



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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamps: Free as a Bird (149468)

Cardstocks: Very Vanilla (101650), Pear Pizzazz (131201), Soft Suede (115318), Mint Macaron (138337)

Notecards: Bird Ballard Laser-Cut Cards & Tin (149595)

Die Cutting: Stitched Shapes Dies (152323), Painted Labels Dies (151605), Die Cutting Machine

Embossing Folder: Subtle 3D (151775)

DSP: Neutrals 6x6 DSP (149614)

Ink: Memento Tuxedo Black (132708)

Blends: Soft Suede Light (146874), Soft Suede Dark (146875), Mint Macaron Light (147020), Mossy Meadow Light (148545)

Ribbon & Trim: Very Vanilla Scalloped Lace Trim (149593), Mint Macaron Sheer Linen Ribbon (151321)

Tools: Paper Snips (103579), Paper Trimmer (152392), Bone Folder (102300)

Misc: Pearl Basic Jewels (144219)

Adhesives: Dimensionals (104430), Fine Tip Glue Pen (138309), Snail (104332)

Instructions:

1. Take a notecard from Bird Ballard Laser-Cut Cards – cut 3 pieces of cardstock to measure 4" x 1 3/4" – use your Fine Tip Glue Pen to apply glue to the back of the laser cut front panel and adhere your strips in place.
2. Use a die from Painted Labels Dies to cut out a piece of patterned paper – cut the die cut paper shape in half - and adhere it in place where desired
3. Use the largest circle die from Stitched Shapes Dies to cut out a circle – then run it through your embossing machine with the Subtles 3D Embossing Folder to give it some texture and adhere in place
4. Wrap a piece of Very Vanilla Scalloped Lace Trim around the card and above it, a piece of Mint Macaron Ribbon, finishing with a knot or bow in front
5. Die cut a smaller circle and layer it on using Dimensionals
6. Stamp the bird, stems & leaves and flower – use Blends Markers to color them in and sharp scissors to carefully cut them out – and adhere to the small circle you just
7. Stamp a sentiment – cut it out and adhere in place with Dimensionals – and pop a little Pearl Jewel beneath the birds' feet for a cute finishing touch – and voila! Your card is ready for giving 😊
