

DINOSAUR TIN PLAYSET

Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

- Reinkers: Old Olive, Pool Party, Pretty Peacock, Sarah Sand, Soft Suede
- Cardstock: (scrap) Whisper White
- Designer Paper: Dinoroar
- Accessories:
- Tools: Paper Trimmer, Big Shot, Dino Dies, Paper Snips, Multipurpose Liquid Glue, White Embossing Paste, Palette Knives
- Miscellaneous: Miniature Toy Dinosuars, Empty Altoid Tin, Pencil, Mod Podge, Small Foam Brush, Paper Towel, Little Paper Cups, White Acrylic Paint, Small Paint Brushes, Stir Stick

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. Wash and dry an empty Altoid Tin.



2. Open up the tin and begin making your Dinosaur area by spreading the Embossing Paste on the bottom of the container using the Palette Knives. Spread an even coat all over the bottom. Then add a little pond by pushing up some of the paste and leaving up some sides. For the mountain or volcano, add a big glob of the Paste to the other side and for slopes on the side and flatten the top. (Be sure it is not too tall that the lid will not close.) You will need to let this dry over night.



3. Now that the paste is dry it's time to paint your landscape. Add a little squirt of the White Acrylic Glue to a small paper cup. Add some drops of Pool Party Reinker. Stir and check color add more if needed. Paint the water hole with it. Moving on to the mountain, using another cup, more paint and Sarah Sand, paint the mountain and a little below. Next mix up some Old Olive with the paint and paint some grass. Go back to the water and mix up some Pretty Peacock and paint over the water, leaving a little Pool Party showing through. When the mountain is dry paint over it again with Soft Suede paint. Set Aside to dry or use a hair dryer for faster drying.



4. After Paint is dry - Using the Dinoroar DSP and a pencil trace around the lid twice and cut out. And around the bottom of the tin once. Here's a tip: If you are wanting a specific part of the DSP to show make a template by using a scrap of yardstick. Draw around image and then cut out the middle. Use the waste piece to look through to see what you want your piece to look like. Trace around and cut out.






5. Cut two piece of matching DSP: (1) a short 1/4" x 11 3/4" and (1) 1/2" x 11 3/4". Wrap them around the tin starting at the middle back and using a pencil mark the notches.



6. Cut out the notches and glue to tin using Mod Podge and foam brush.





7. Attach the top and bottom pieces to the tin. After tin is dry add a top coat of Mod Podge. Also attach the inside piece. (no need to top coat it)



8. Roughly cut out a tree from the DSP and glue to a scrap of Whisper White Cardstock. The fussy cut it out. Cut out a dinosaur from the DSP to with the Big Shot and Dino Dies. Add a top coat of Mod Podge to the dinosaur.





9. Attach the dinosaur to the outside top of the tin using Multipurpose Liquid Glue.



10. Cut a little slit in the dried paste where you want the tree to go and glue it down. (It will bend down and be fine when tin is closed) Add the little dinosaurs to the inside and you are done!
