## Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Stamps: Gnome for the Holidays (153322), Warm \& Toasty (152615)
Dies: Curvy Dies (156228), Home Together Dies (153515), Stampin Cut \& Emboss (149653)
Cardstocks: Shimmery White (101910), Whisper White (100730), Misty Moonlight (153081)
DSP: Trimming the Town (153491)
Embossing: Winter Snow Embossing Folder (153577)
Ink: Misty Moonlight (153118), Memento Tuxedo Black (132708), Pool Party (147107)
Blends Markers: Petal Pink (154893), Ivory (154922), Crumb Cake (154882), Cherry Cobber (154880), Real Red (154899), Balmy Blue (154830), Basic Black (154843), Smoky Slate (154904), Granny Apple Green (154885), Old Olive (154892), Rococo Rose (154900), Mango Melody (154888)

Twine: Flowers for Every Season Ribbon Combo Pack (153620)
Tools: Paper Trimmer (152392), Paper Snips (103579), Simply Scored (122334), Bone Folder (102300),
Misc: Whisper White Medium Envelopes (107301) OR Very Vanilla Medium Envelopes (107300), All the Trimmings Embellishments (153540), Wink of Stella Clear Glitter Brush (141897)
Adhesives: Tear \& Tape (138995), Dimensionals (104430), Snail (104332)

Cut a piece of cardstock to measure $31 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4^{\prime \prime}-$ this will be the back section


Cut two pieces to measure $21 / 4^{\prime \prime} \times 51 / 2^{\prime \prime}-$ these are the box pieces


Place one of the box pieces into your scoring tool and score at $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ and 4 "


And repeat for the other


Fold along the score lines and use your bone folder to make those folds nice and crisp


If desired, trim the tops of the corners of the small strips on an angle and apply strong adhesive tape to them


Line up your box pieces as shown below - the $1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ tab to the small panel of the other piece and adhere in place


To make your insert dividers - use curved landscape dies to cut two or three pieces - the top two die cuts below are from Home Together Dies and the bottom dotted one is from Curvy Dies


Take your first insert and place on your box - use your fingers to wrap each end around your box - this will give you fold lines and create your tabs


Use your bone folder to make these nice and crisp - the tab on the left should fold backwards and the one on the right forwards - this will allow your card to fold and fit in an envelope


Next trim down each tab - make a cut about 1/4" down from the top edge and angle out - this will allow you're the curvy part to stand up and out of the box


Apply strong adhesive tape to the tabs and position inside your box


Fold over to the right side to make sure your card will lay nice and flat - if it does not, gently peel off the tab on the right and push your card flat - this will allow your tab to find it's fit (:)


Repeat for your second insert, again making sure your box card will lay nice and flat and adjusting this insert where necessary


You can add a third insert if you wish to - I decided to stick with two and this is how it looks from above


Apply tape to the bottom part of your back section and slide into the back of your box and adhere in place


And as you can see, your box card will fold flat and fit into a standard A2 Medium sized envelope
