Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Cardstocks: Basic White (166780), Basic Black (121045)

Designer Series Paper: Turtle-y Cute (165221)

Stamps: Good Luck (167223)

Inks: Stazon Jet Black (101406)

Bag: Iridescent Treat Bags (166204)

Die: Nested Essentials (161597)

Heat Embossing: Metallics Embossing Powders (165678), Heat Tool (129053), Versamark Ink Pad (102283)

Ribbon, Twine & Embellishments: Mossy Meadow & Gold 1/4" Ribbon (166158), Gold & White Bakers Twine (166005), Loose Gold Sequins (165267)

Tools: Simply Scored (122334), Paper Trimmer (152392), Bone Folder (102300)

Adhesives: Mini Glue Dots (103863), Tear & Tape (154031), Dimensionals (104430)

Misc: Chocolate Coins, Handheld Circle Punch

Cut a piece of cardstock to measure 8 3/8" x 2 1/2"- put into your scoring tool with a long edge along the top and score at 1", 2", 3", 4", 5", 6", 7" and 8" - fold along all score lines



Place a strip of very strong adhesive tape on the smallest section, line up and secure in place



And there is your basic container



For the bottom you need to print out this template directly onto a piece of cardstock:

It will print out at the correct size that you need.

Cut out the circle and down each solid line to create tabs - it is all hidden inside the mug so it doesn't matter if it isn't super neat



Turn over and put a small piece of strong adhesive tape onto each tab and careful fold into your container



Push the tabs to adhere to the container walls and you are ready for decorating!



I used black cardstock for my container and yes, you can print that template out onto it and you are still able to see to cut along the lines!



This is how I decorated – all items that I used are listed in the supply list at the top of this Project Sheet:
