



LINDT CHOCOLATE CARROTS EASTER TREAT BOX

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Stampin' Up! Supplies Used:

Cardstocks: Basic White (166780), Garden Green (102584), Pecan Pie (161717)

Dies: Stylish Shapes (159183), Match Day (167522)

Designer Series Paper: Hobby Haven (167201), Brights 6x6 (165301)

Stamp: Easter Basket (166940)

Inks: Pecan Pie (161665), Tuxedo Black Memento (132708),

Stampin' Blends Markers: Granny Apple Green (154885), Pumpkin Pie (154897)

Embellishments: Sparkle Dot Essentials (166991), Misty Moonlight & White 1/4" Ribbon Pack (165276)

Adhesives: Tear & Tape (154031), Mini Glue Dots (103683), Dimensionals (104430), Stampin' Seal (149699)

Misc: Box of Lindt Chocolate Carrots, 1/2" Circle Punch

You will need to purchase a box of 4 Lindt Chocolate Carrots



Carefully remove the outer box to reveal the piece the carrots stand up in



Cut a piece of cardstock for the 'soil' to measure 4" x 1"



Remove the carrots and carefully peel the top of the box apart to reveal just the top line of holes - you will use this as a template



Place your cardstock under the holes, flip over and use a pencil to draw around them



Remove and this is what you will have:



Use a 1/2" Circle Punch to cut the holes out, using your pencil holes as the guide



Use strong adhesive tape to reassemble your box



And use Mini Glue Dots to adhere the 'soil' in place



To create the box cover - cut a piece of cardstock to measure 11" x 2" and place into your scoring tool with a long edge at the top - score at 1", 5", 6" and 10" and fold along all score lines



Take the grass die from Match Dies and place at the very top of one of the long segments and run through your die cutting machine



Repeat for the second long segment



And this is what you will have:



Use sharp scissors to cut down the score lines to free the die cut parts



Add strong adhesive tape to the two large panels and wrap around the box and secure in place - adhere the end flap and you are ready to decorate!



If you wish to add a band of patterned paper cut a piece to measure 11" x 1 3/4" and score at 1", 5 1/8", 6 1/8" and 10 1/8" - and adhere in place



And now you are ready to add your finishing touches and plant your carrots!
